Cathie Adams of Texas Eagle Forum to speak

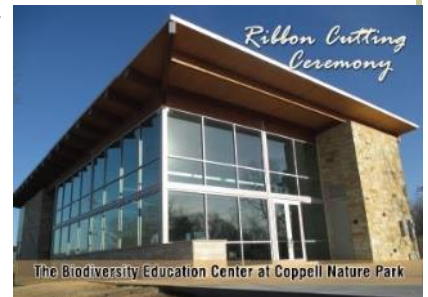
Please join us for our **May 4, 2014** meeting when our speaker will be Cathie Adams.

Photo ID vs. Voter Certificate -

Your name on your Photo ID must match identically to your name on the registered voters list. If it does not, but is “substantially similar,” you will be allowed to vote after initialing a column on the sign-in sheet at the polls. If it is not “substantially similar,” you will be allowed to vote provisionally.
