CISD's New Facility Visioning Team

Over the next 10 years, the district is predicted to exceed 14,000 students and CISD will need to ensure facilities are in place that meet those needs while reflecting the desires of the community. To that end, Superintendent, Dr. Mike Waldrip, recently convened a 44-member Facility Visioning Team to help address the projected growth. Team members included 29 parents and community members, 3 learners, and 12 teachers and administrators.

To date Traffick911 has provided a prevention and awareness message to 12,665 people, including over 3900 young people. They have trained 3,794 first Responders to identify and rescue victims. 70 victims of sex trafficking have been identified or rescued.

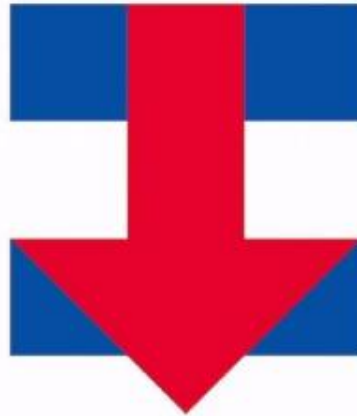

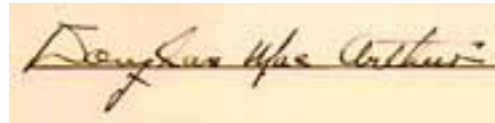

The First United Methodist Church (FUMC) has volunteered for the last several years to pick up food items and deliver to the families that have been qualified for this program in the CISD boundaries. Metrocrest plans the menus, acquires the food and funding and processes the food into packages. FUMC volunteers pick up the food on Saturday at the Metrocrest warehouse and deliver to the church to re-process into family size packages. Volunteers then deliver to the families. In 2014 they supported 100 families with 216 children totaling 15,000 meals. Program is 11 weeks through the summer. FUMC also provides this service Thanksgiving week. These special group sessions give women who have served in the military the camaraderie of being with peers who understand the unique experiences that have impacted them and the challenges they face when returning home. We collaborate with referring agencies that serve female veterans and are expanding our outreach every day. On their initial visit to Attitudes & Attire, clients receive one suit with a coordinating blouse, a scarf, a handbag, jewelry, and pantyhose. On their second visit they may select shoes, and during their third dressing clients choose a variety of workplace and business casual clothing to complement their wardrobe. Love Thy Neighbor is 100% volunteer based. We opened our doors in Nov. 2010 managing the Salvation Army Community Kitchen in Lewisville. Hot lunches are served 5 days a week to the needy and homeless. LTN also manages the Clothing Assistance Program (CAP). Gently worn donated clothing items are distributed at no-charge to qualified clients. Volunteers chop, cook, and serve meals in the Community Kitchen and assist in the CAP make or collect blankets and clothing for **Love Thy Baby.**

CASA

On an average day in Dallas County, more than 2,000 abused and neglected children live in foster care because they cannot live safely at home. These children need powerful voices to speak for them. 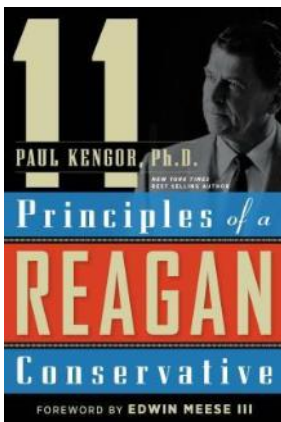
Dallas County GOP Reagan Day Dinner January 2015

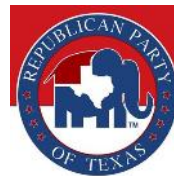


TFRW Legislative Day April 16
