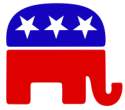

## President's Pen

The Texas Federation of Republican Women's Legislative Day was Thursday, April 6<sup>th</sup> in Austin. The CRW were well represented by Michelle LaFountain, Jane Anne Sellars, Linda Mays, Lisa Armstrong, Karlyn Brownlee, Sharon Kappers and Kit Whitehill. The sea of red was a beautiful sight as Republican women from all over Texas filled the House and Senate galleries in their red jackets.

If you have not heard, TFRW kicked off their fundraising efforts to raise money for Patriot Paws in 2017 at Legislative Day. Our goal was to present

one veteran with a service dog during the Dallas convention October 19-21. The cost to train a service dog and teach a veteran how to work with their dog is \$30,000 and there are currently over 150 veterans on the wait list for a dog. In less than 36 hours, TFRW raised the \$30,000 needed to sponsor a dog! Lt. Governor Dan Patrick was so moved by our efforts, that he committed to raise the additional \$30,000 for a second dog. TFRW isn't stopping with two dogs; we are encouraging all clubs to continue raising money so we can provide 3 or more veter-

ans with a service dog. Nothing is impossible when TFRW women work together to accomplish a goal. If you would like to help with this effort, please send your check made payable to Patriot Paws to our address below. Don't forget, if you haven't renewed your membership dues, now is the time do so. We need your support to accomplish our programs including our scholarship program, Wreaths Across America program, and literacy program. We hope to see you at one of our upcoming events this spring. The Coppel Republican Women are proud to participate in the Barbara Bush Literacy Library Project. This initiative is based on the premise that all children deserve an equal opportunity to achieve. Lower literacy levels are linked to poor health, fewer economic opportunities and an increased dependence on welfare. Enhancing school libraries and literacy programs helps equip children with the pow-

er of literacy so they can achieve the American Dream. Our next book donation is with Tom Landry Elementary School in Irving. Tom Landry Elementary is located in the Carrollton-Farmers Branch ISD, in the nearby Valley Ranch area of Irving. Their diverse school population is 69.6% economically disadvantaged with a 25.2% mobility rate. Both of these statistics are higher than the state averages.

The American Fallen Soldiers Project was formed to help provide comfort and healing to the grieving families of our fallen military. This 501c3 non-profit organization makes available at no cost to the family an original portrait of their fallen loved one that fully captures their appearance and personality. Since the inception of The American Fallen Soldiers Project in 2007 hundreds of portraits have been painted and presented to the families of Ameri-

ca's fallen military across the United States. However, because of their extensive backlog and with the arrival of new requests daily, there are countless families still to be helped for years to come.

Phil and Lisa Taylor have invited the CRW to a private gallery tour on May 21st from 4:00 - 6:00 pm. CRW will provide light refreshments. Like most 501c3 non-profits, fundraising is vital. The AFSP currently has a brick fundraiser as

well as other opportunities to donate and volunteer.

When you buy a brick, you're helping to support their mission to honor, respect and memorialize the American military service members who have made the ultimate sacrifice for our nation. Each custom inscribed brick will be permanently installed on their Walk of Honor located at The American Fallen Soldiers National Gallery.

## Texas Federation of Republican Women Legislative Day



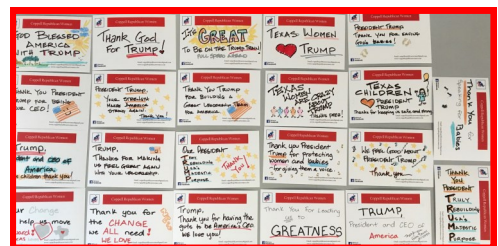

Every Saturday Sharon reports to the USO at DFW Airport Terminal B to provide meals, snacks and beverages to service members who are traveling to a new duty station or heading for home.

The USO provides facilities for service members and their families to rest, read, access technology or just have a quiet place.

Originally from Wisconsin, Sharon is a big Green Bay Packers fan as well as the University of Wisconsin and never misses a game.

Sharon began volunteering at the USO in 2012 and has accumulated over 895 service hours

and considers the work she does there a privilege. She also assists the USO at special events such as air shows, and escorting Medal of Honor recipients, wounded warriors and Gold Star families. An especially exciting time is in December when she volunteers at Exodus, when troops from Fort Sill and Sheppard and Goodfellow AFBs



are bussed to DFW to travel home for the holiday.

She will start training very soon for Fallen Soldier escort services. She also volunteers every year at SnowBall Ex-

press, an event designed especially for the children of fallen military. She participates in Carry the Load, an annual event held in Dallas to raise awareness to the true meaning of Memorial Day. Carry the Load also raises money for veterans and first responders.

Another of Sharon's past achievements is participating in Honor Flights into and out of D/FW. Her position on the CRW board is called Caring for America and she exemplifies this in everything she does for our military and veterans. The USO is always in need of packaged snacks and full size candy bars. 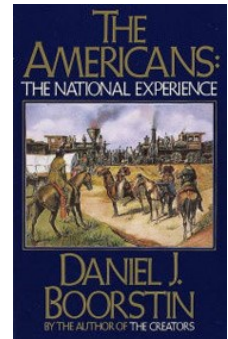

## Membership Drive and New Member Orientation

The Dallas Morning News article published on December 6, 2016 stated the new DA “she sees herself as a ‘servant leader’ who wants the public to believe in the prosecutors at the DA’s office.” Ms. Johnson, a Republican and former judge, said she will be working for all people regardless of where they live in
