THE PRESIDENT'S PEN

Friends, Bill and I experienced a life-changing event Friday night. Several Catholic organizations reserved SEVEN theaters at NorthPark AMC for the emotionally stirring movie, <u>Unplanned</u>. Unfortunately, most people have not heard of <u>Unplanned</u>, and that needs to change.

Unplanned is the true story of Abby Johnson who worked at Planned Parenthood in Bryan, Texas for eight years. Abby rose through the ranks from volunteer escort to become one of the youngest clinic directors in the nation. She was awarded the Employee of the Year in

2008, in part for running a clinic that was highly profitable due to her churning out record numbers of abortions. But all the while, Abby had not actually seen what her hard work and dedication was facilitating. Not until she was asked to assist in an ultrasound-guided abortion.

In <u>an article with Fox News</u>, Abby shares: "Everything changed.... Some images stick with you forever, images that you can't unsee. The photo of the first responder carrying the limp child in his arms after the Oklahoma City bombing. The photos of the Twin Towers falling. These images burn in your mind, causing you to replay them over and over again. That was what I saw on the ultrasound screen... head, arms and legs... abortion instrument... life ended and... a black empty uterus. In that moment, I saw for myself what I was supporting for the last eight years and it broke me."

Friends, abortion is a terrible, terrible thing and as uncomfortable as it is, we must expose the truth. I beg you to go see this movie. Like Bill and I, you won't be able to "unsee" what we saw, and what Abby saw that fateful day.



Republican Priority Legislation: To Be or Not to Be?



The 86th Legislative Session is at the halfway point, but much work remains to be done. This year, the State Republican Executive Committee's

Legislative Priorities Committee created the Strategic Texas Activist Team (STAT) and five subcommittees, called "Working Groups," to track and lobby priority legislation. Priorities were determined by the 2018 Delegates to the Republican Party of Texas (RPT) State Convention.

Our top five priorities for 2019 (in short) are:

- 1. Pass Constitutional Carry
- 2. End Taxpayer-Funded Lobbying
- 3. Defend Pro-Life
- 4. Reform Property Tax
- 5. Ensure Religious Freedom & Privacy

The Legislative Priorities Committee and Working Groups have been busy constantly since the November election. They hold weekly conference calls, monitor legislative activities, and actively encourage lawmakers to favor or oppose bills that have been vetted and voted on. Many have traveled to Austin to testify at hearings, record their position on legislation, and visit with legislators and staff. All Republicans are highly encouraged to stay abreast of what's happening in Austin and join the fight.
