I hope you enjoyed a relaxing summer. I am always sad to see summer end, but this year the end of summer means our TFRW convention is right around the corner; and that is very exciting!

The 32nd Biennial TFRW Convention will be held October 3-5 at Moody Gardens in Galveston. This 3-day convention provides the



biggest, most sought after forum to meet our local, state and federal candidates and elected officials. Attendees will also attend informative breakout

sessions, network with amazing women from around the state, and elect the TFRW officers for 2020-2021 as well as our SD 16 TFRW District Director.

According to TFRW bylaws, clubs are allowed one delegate and one alternate for each ten active members, and an additional delegate and alternate for a remainder of six to nine members. We currently have 59 active members giving us six delegates and six alternates. Please email me by midnight August 21 if you are an active member and interested in attending the Galveston convention as a delegate or an alternate. Our Standing Rules state that club officers have preference before members in the selection of delegates to NFRW and TFRW conventions, but we have plenty of spots for everyone who would like to attend.

## **CRW President Honored with State Nomination**

Congratulations to our own CRW President, Kit Whitehill, on her nomination as First Vice President of the Texas Federation of Republican Women (TFRW) for the 2019-2021 term. TFRW is our immediate parent organization, and the state level governing body under the National Federation of Republican Women (NFRW). The TFRW Nominating Committee interviewed applicants and, on June 22, presented a slate of officers to the TFRW Board of Directors. Voting delegates from RW clubs across the state will convene in October at the TFRW Biennial State Convention in Galveston to make the official decision.



Kit's vision of women making a difference in politics led to the establishment of Coppell Republican Women in 2012. Along with serving as our CRW President she is currently serving on the Executive Board of TFRW in the role of Community Engagement. She was a TFRW Tribute to Women Honoree in 2018, and TFRW State Convention Chair in 2017. Kit also presently serves as the Fundraising Director for the Dallas County Council of Republican Women, all while working full-time at Coppell MS East. In her spare time, Kit provides key support to the Justice Bill Whitehill reelection campaign and enjoys her grandchildren.

## The 86th Legislative Session Review



House Representatives and Senators from across the state of Texas met in Austin from January 8 – May 27, 2019 to make additions, deletions and revisions to Texas law. Texans will vote on ten measures as constitutional amendments on Tuesday, November 5.

Over one thousand bills passed both houses from the more than 7,500 bills that were filed. Subsequently, 1,323 bills were signed into law, and 58 bills were vetoed by the Governor.
