
- Join us on November 4 as we hear from U.S. Army Veteran Paul Slough in honor of Veterans Day.

3 other veterans were no strangers to combat. They made a split-second decision in an Iraqi war zone during an emergency which led to 13 years of political persecution and wrongful imprisonment. Paul and the others, now known as the Biden 4, were pardoned by President Donald Trump in December of 2020.
